WHO	WHOM
Subject pronoun	Object pronoun
Doing the action	Receiving the action <i>Always</i> follows a preposition (with whom, for whom, by whom, to whom, from whom, of whom, on whom, etc...)
Test with “he” or “they”	Test with “ <u>him</u> ” or “ <u>them</u> ”
She is the teacher <i>who</i> does not give homework. <i>Who</i> is leading the talk?	To <i>whom</i> did you give the book? With <i>whom</i> are you meeting today? For the award, I chose my grammar teacher, <i>whom</i> I really like.

Who/Whom Practice Questions

- To who/whom did you give the pretty flowers?
- Ms. Brown is a teacher that/who/whom inspires her students.
- With who/whom do you live?
- Whoever/Whomever did this should be fired!
- Angela was curious about the unopened letter and wondered for who/whom it was meant.
